The TGA Foundation works with golf courses to carefully select motivated high school age students. Prospective interns complete a thorough application process detailing their interests and goals and are interviewed by both the TGA representative and their prospective club. Once hired by a club, interns work on a rotating schedule providing them with opportunities to work in several areas of club operations. The clubs get to fill seasonal employment needs and obtain grant funding from the TGA Foundation to offset a large portion of the personnel costs
