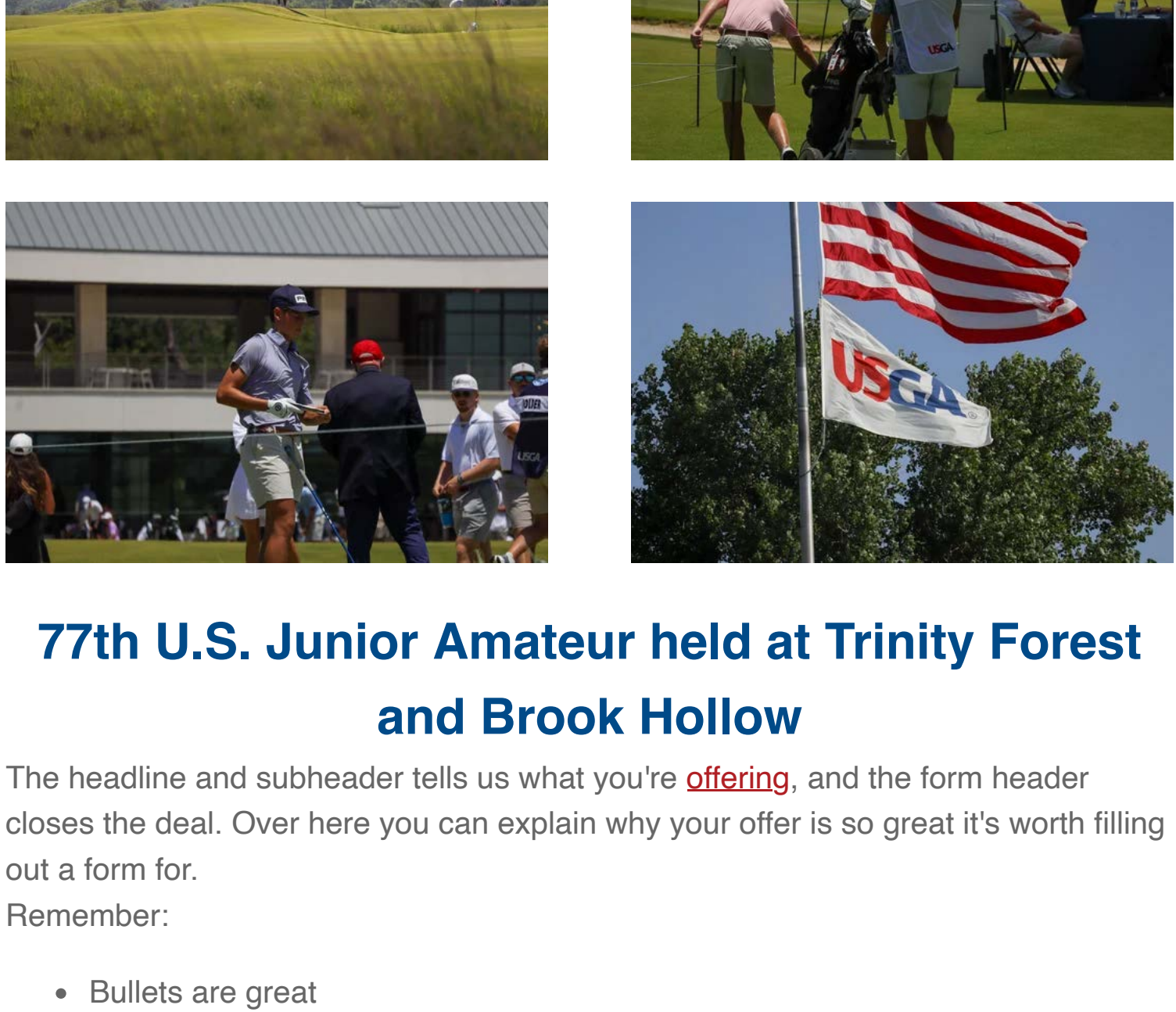

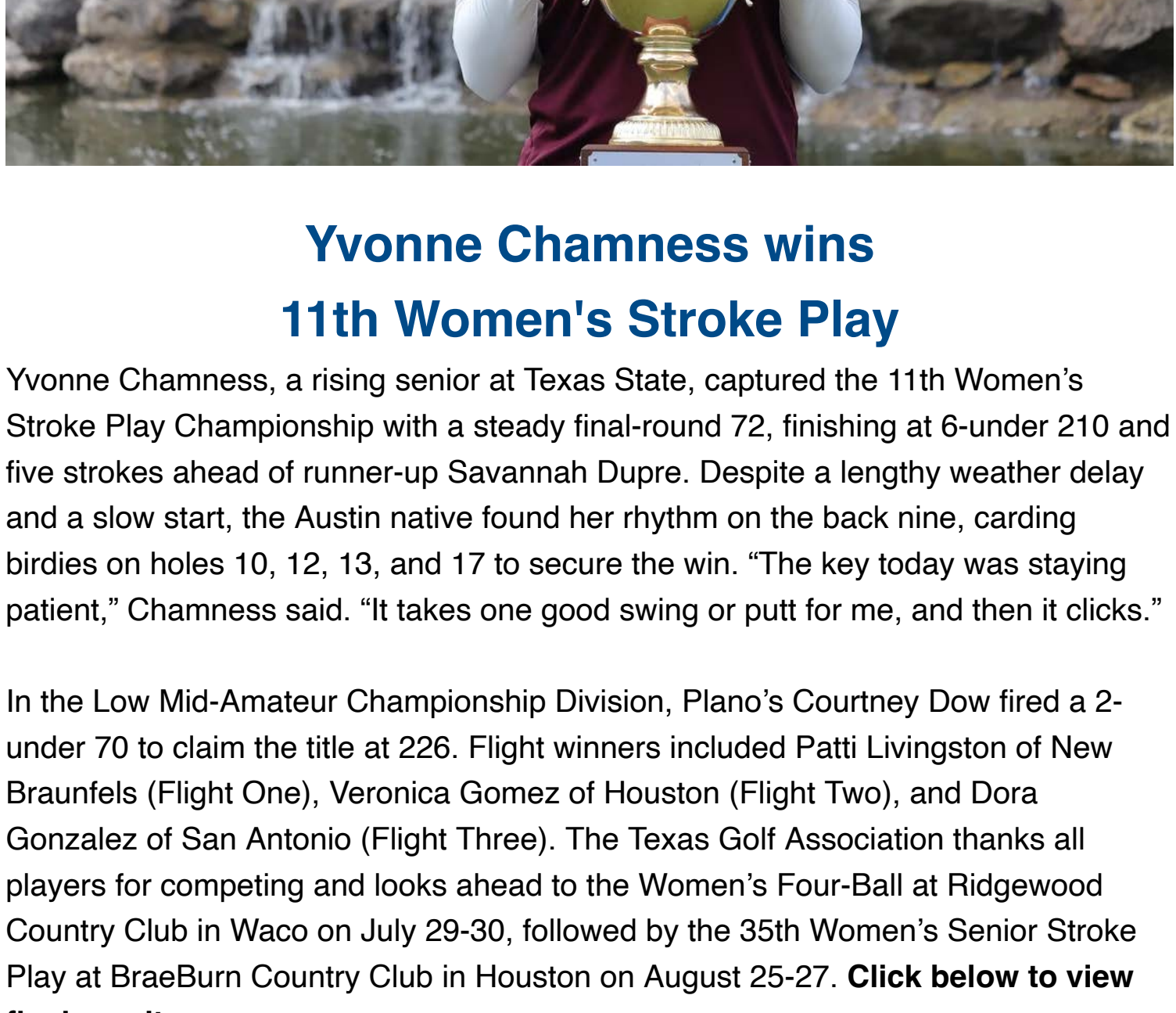


### 77th U.S. Junior Amateur held at Trinity Forest and Brook Hollow

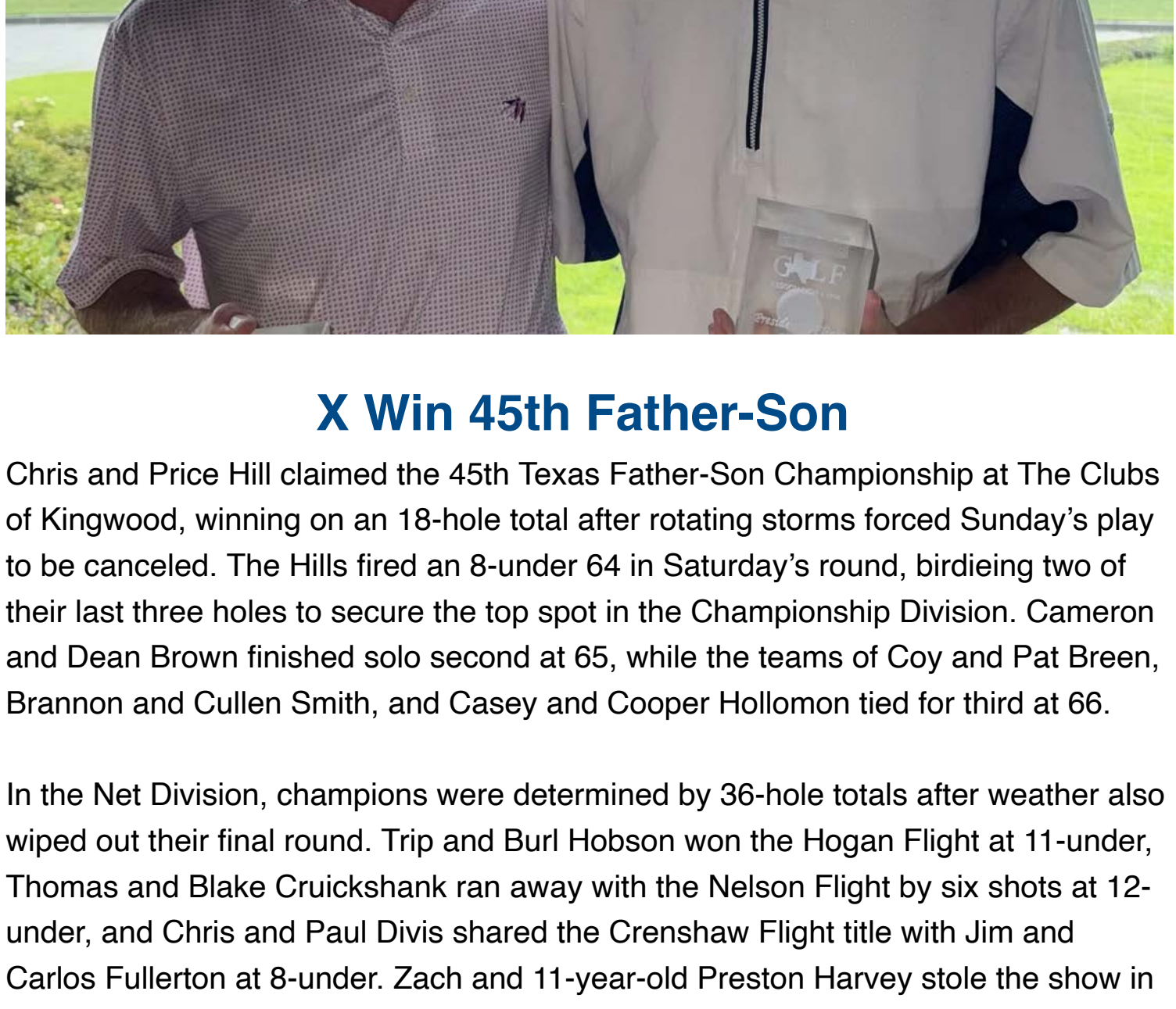


### Yvonne Chamness wins 11th Women's Stroke Play

Yvonne Chamness, a rising senior at Texas State, captured the 11th Women's Stroke Play Championship with a steady final-round 72, finishing at 6-under 210 and five strokes ahead of runner-up Savannah Dupre. Despite a lengthy weather delay and a slow start, the Austin native found her rhythm on the back nine, carding birdies on holes 10, 12, 13, and 17 to secure the win. "The key today was staying patient," Chamness said. "It takes one good swing or putt for me, and then it clicks."

In the Low Mid-Amateur Championship Division, Plano's Courtney Dow fired a 2-under 70 to claim the title at 226. Flight winners included Patti Livingston of New Braunfels (Flight One), Veronica Gomez of Houston (Flight Two), and Dora Gonzalez of San Antonio (Flight Three). 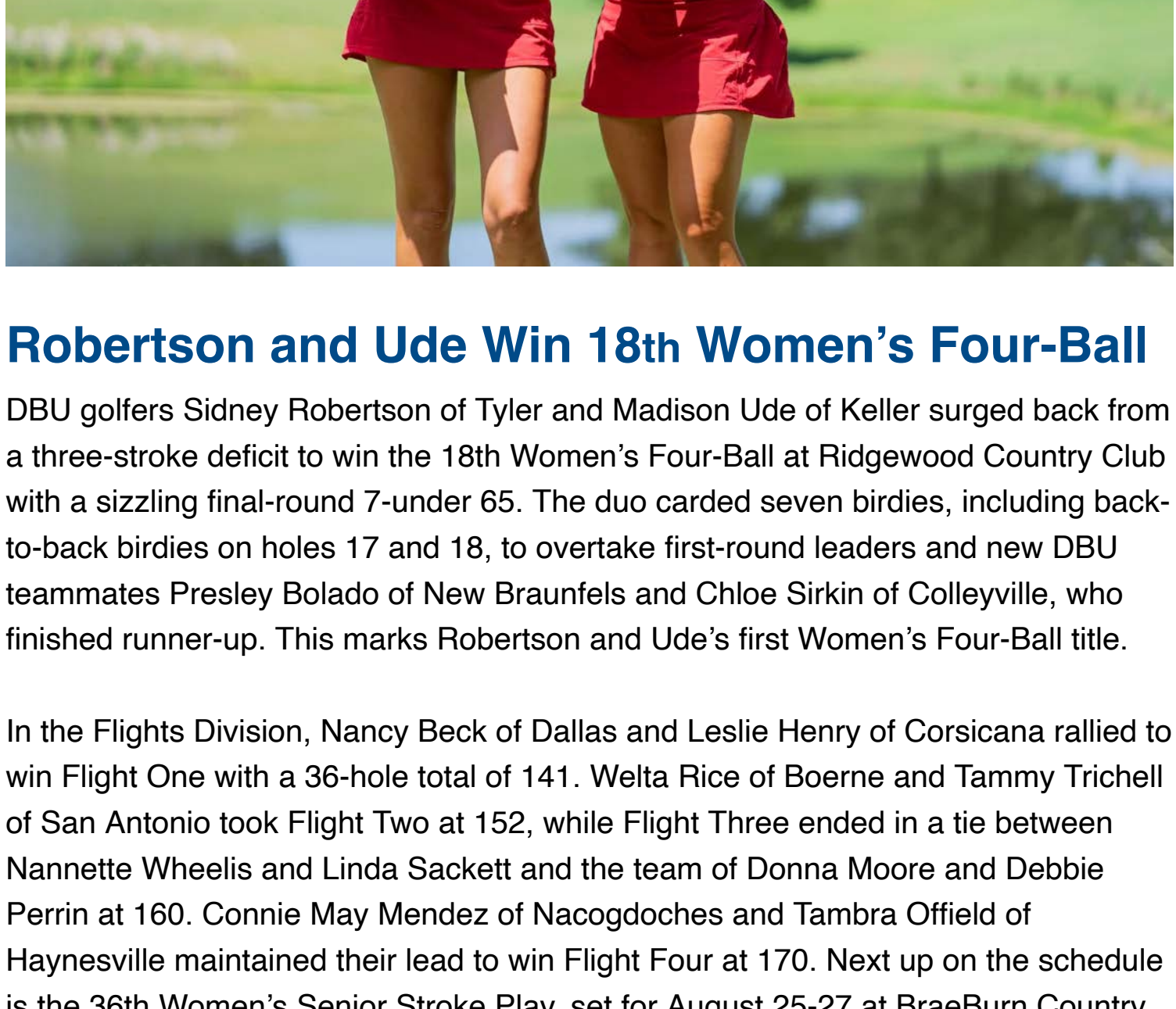


### X Win 45th Father-Son

Chris and Price Hill claimed the 45th Texas Father-Son Championship at The Clubs of Kingwood, winning on an 18-hole total after rotating storms forced Sunday's play to be canceled. The Hills fired an 8-under 64 in Saturday's round, birdieing two of their last three holes to secure the top spot in the Championship Division. Cameron and Dean Brown finished solo second at 65, while the teams of Coy and Pat Breen, Brannon and Cullen Smith, and Casey and Cooper Hollomon tied for third at 66.

In the Net Division, champions were determined by 36-hole totals after weather also wiped out their final round. Trip and Burl Hobson won the Hogan Flight at 11-under, Thomas and Blake Cruickshank ran away with the Nelson Flight by six shots at 12-under, and Chris and Paul Davis shared the Crenshaw Flight title with Jim and Carlos Fullerton at 8-under. Zach and 11-year-old Preston Harvey stole the show in the Kite Flight, carding a blistering 62 on Saturday to win by six at 15-under. [Click below to view final results.](#)

DBU golfers Sidney Robertson of Tyler and Madison Ude of Keller surged back from a three-stroke deficit to win the 18th Women's Four-Ball at Ridgewood Country Club with a sizzling final-round 7-under 65. The duo carded seven birdies, including back-to-back birdies on holes 17 and 18, to overtake first-round leaders and new DBU teammates Presley Bolado of New Braunfels and Chloe Sirkin of Colleyville, who finished runner-up. This marks Robertson and Ude's first Women's Four-Ball title.

In the Flights Division, Nancy Beck of Dallas and Leslie Henry of Corsicana rallied to win Flight One with a 36-hole total of 141. Welta Rice of Boerne and Tammy Trichell of San Antonio took Flight Two at 152, while Flight Three ended in a tie between Nannette Wheels and Linda Sackett and the team of Donna Moore and Debbie Perrin at 160. Connie May Mendez of Nacogdoches and Tamara Offield of Haynesville maintained their lead to win Flight Four at 170. 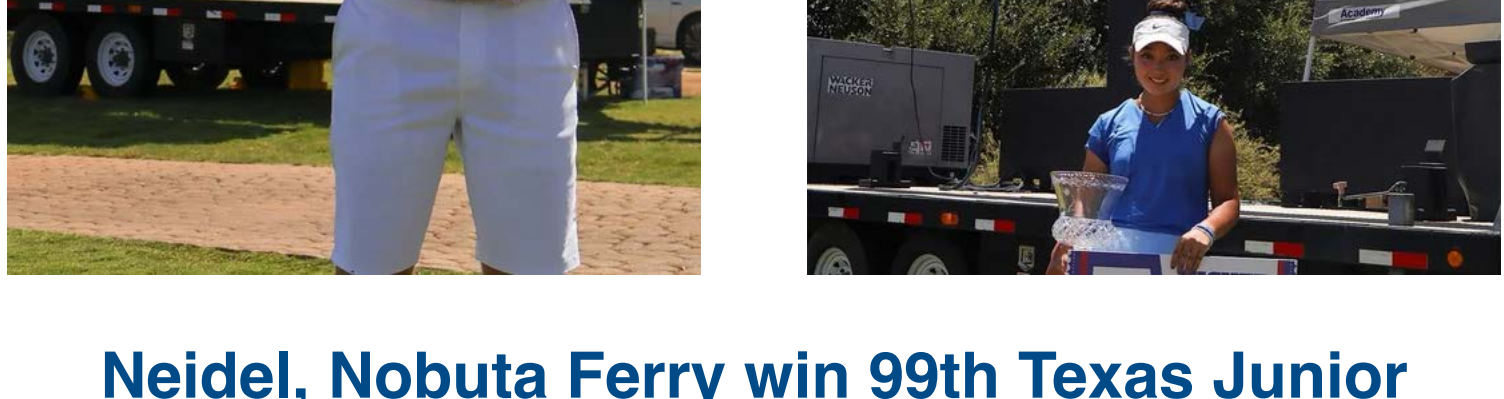


### Chris Wheeler victorious at 27th Mid-Amateur Match Play

Chris Wheeler of Lewisville captured his second Texas Mid-Amateur Match Play Championship in five years at Rockwall Golf & Athletic Club, going bogey-free over his final three matches to secure a 483 win over Harrison Mahon in the final. Wheeler's steady play and timely birdies helped him navigate a field that included co-medalists Brad Mason and Adam House, as well as No. 31 seed Shane Heise, who made a Cinderella run to the semifinals.

The 27th edition of the championship featured stroke play qualifying followed by a 32-player match play bracket, with memorable moments including Mason's hole-in-one in the semifinals and a quarterfinal showdown between past champions Wheeler and Colby Harwell. Wheeler now turns his focus to the U.S. Mid-Amateur Championship, while the next TGA event, the 50th Texas Four-Ball, will be held August 22 at Tempest Golf Club in Gladewater.

### Neidel, Nobuta Ferry win 99th Texas Junior Amateur Boys and Girls Division

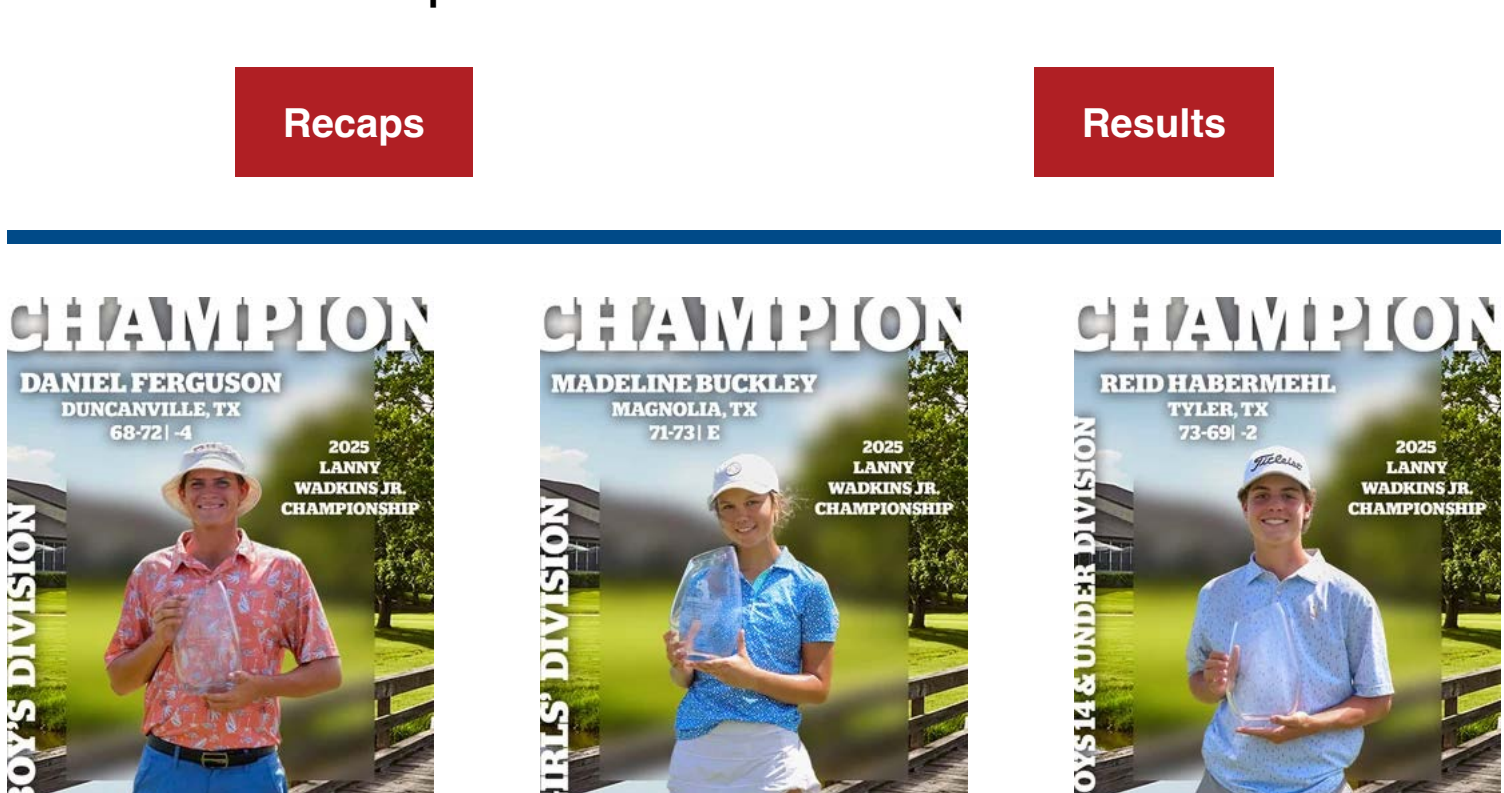
Tyler Neidel of Lakeway and Honorine Nobuta Ferry of Flower Mound claimed titles at the 99th Texas Junior Amateur presented by Edwin Watts Golf, closing out the 2025 junior major season in style at Horseshoe Bay. Neidel, a Jacksonville State commit, rallied from second place with three birdies on the front nine and held off a tight leaderboard to secure the Boys Division victory, earning an exemption into the 78th U.S. Junior Amateur at Saucon Valley in 2026. Nobuta Ferry delivered a dominant final round in the Girls Division, firing a 7-under 65 — highlighted by six birdies and a hole-out eagle — to finish at 11-under and capture her second consecutive Texas Junior Amateur title, along with a spot in the 77th U.S. Girls' Junior Amateur at Old Chatham Golf Club.

The field was stacked with impressive performances, as Lucas Latimer, Jaxson Henegar, and Jace Huelt tied for second in the Boys Division at 4-under, while Gia Ahlowalia and Shyla Brown rounded out the Girls Division top three. This year's championship marked Nobuta Ferry as the first back-to-back Girls Division winner since 2016, further cementing her as one of the top junior players in the state. The Legends Junior Tour extends its thanks to presenting sponsor Edwin Watts Golf and Horseshoe Bay Resort for their continued support in making the 99th Texas Junior Amateur a standout event.

In the Boys 14 & Under Division, Lincoln Rubis of Farmers Branch emerged victorious after an eight-birdie performance led to a playoff with Theodore Lieu of Dallas. Rubis captured the title with a par on the third playoff hole. Jessie Lee of San Antonio went wire-to-wire to win the Girls 14 & Under Division. The Class of 2030 player posted consecutive rounds of even-par 72 to win by three strokes. ### Champions crowned at the 2025 Collegiate Preview and Lanny Wadkins Junior Championship

Corrington Case and Eileen Lee each fought through early adversity to claim victories in their divisions during the final round of play.

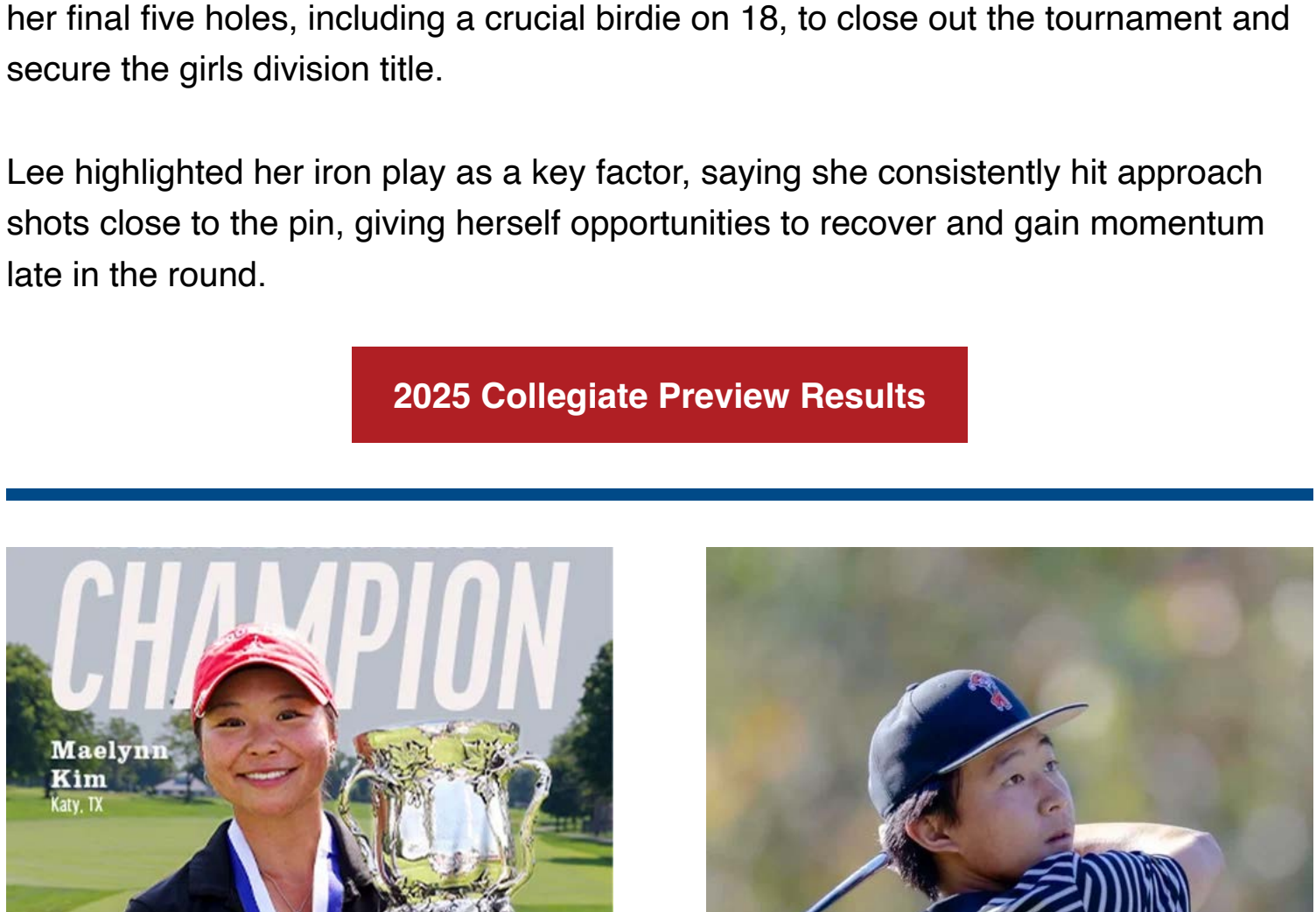
Case, who entered the day with only one bogey through 36 holes, opened his round with another on the first hole but quickly steadied himself. He answered with a birdie on the second and went on to birdie Nos. 6 and 7, creating a cushion he wouldn't relinquish. From there, he parred every remaining hole to cap off a steady, composed performance.

The win marked a breakthrough for Case, who credited his ability to stay calm and rely on his short game as the deciding factor.

Lee's path to victory wasn't as straightforward. The leader heading into the final round, she saw her four-shot advantage shrink to just one after carding a triple bogey on her opening hole. Rather than falter, Lee battled back with three birdies in her final five holes, including a crucial birdie on 18, to close out the tournament and secure the girls division title.

Lee highlighted her iron play as a key factor, saying she consistently hit approach shots close to the pin, giving herself opportunities to recover and gain momentum late in the round.

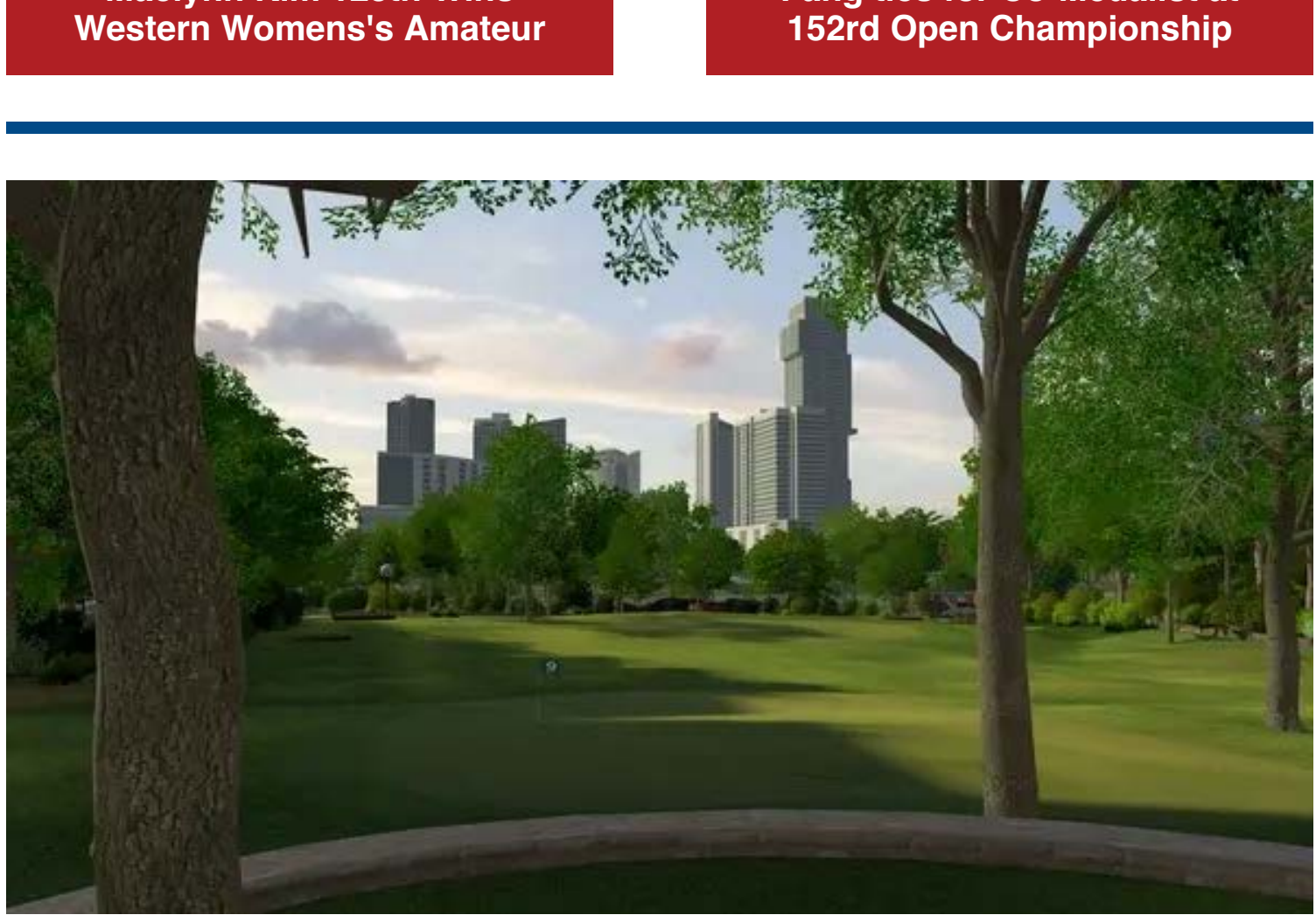
### Maelynn Kim and Ethan Fang

As the 153rd Open kicked off, Amateur and Legends Junior Tour alumni joined an elite list of Oklahoma State golfers to play in one of golf's toughest competitions.

Fang, who earned an exemption from winning The Amateur in Scotland last month, carded strong rounds of 75-70 for a 36-hole 3-over and missed the cut. Fang would earn co-medalist honors for the championship. Houston's Maelynn Kim went wire-to-wire to win the 125th Women's Western Amateur at Red Run Golf Club, edging Elizabeth Rudell 1 up in a thrilling final. The 20-year-old delivered a clutch eagle on the ninth hole and sealed the match with a 15-foot birdie on 18 in front of a roaring gallery, earning one of amateur golf's most prestigious titles — and a spot in the 2025 U.S. Women's Amateur.
