## Scottie Scheffler wins Third Major Championship with win at Quail Hollow

Legends Junior Tour Alum and Texas favorite Scottie Scheffler won the 2025 PGA Championship on Sunday at Quail Hollow Club, closing with a steady 68 to finish at 11-under 273 and claim his third career major championship. The world's top-ranked golfer pulled away from the field with a composed back nine, securing a five-shot victory. Scheffler became the first player since Tiger Woods to win three majors before turning 30 and joined Jack Nicklaus and Woods as the only golfers in the modern era to win 15 PGA Tour events by that age. The win adds to his Masters victories in 2022 and 2024 and further solidifies his standing as the most dominant in the world. The Texas Golf Association and Legends Junior Tour are incredibly proud of all Scheffler has accomplished and will continue to accomplish in the future. ## Longest Day in Golf Includes Dramatic Finish

On May 19, Bent Tree Country Club hosted one of the U.S. Open Final Qualifying events, commonly known as "Golf's Longest Day," where 84 players competed over 36 holes for seven coveted spots in the 125th U.S. Open at Oakmont Country Club. Rasmus Neergaard-Petersen of Denmark led the field with an impressive 11-under-par performance, securing medalist honors. Close behind were James Hahn and Adam Schenk, both finishing at 10-under. Amateurs Lance Simpson and Cameron Tankersley, along with Carlos Ortiz, tied at 8-under, while Johnny Keeler claimed the final qualifying spot at 7-under in a dramatic playoff that went four holes with almost no sunlight left in the day. Notably, several seasoned professionals, including Sergio Garcia, Tador Gooch, and Peter Mainati, failed to qualify. Garcia's absence marks the end of a 25-year streak of consecutive U.S. Open appearances. The Dallas qualifier was one of three held that day, with additional events in Japan and England, collectively filling 18 spots in the U.S. Open field. The remaining qualifiers were determined on June 2 across 10 sites, as players battle for the remaining positions in the championship scheduled for June 12-15 at Oakmont. ## Bluebonnet Championship Crowns 2025 Champions

One of the most anticipated events of the Legends Junior Tour season lived up to the hype once again, as the Bluebonnet Championship brought intense competition and standout performances to Brownwood Country Club.

Landon Hilario of Garland captured the Boys 15-18 Division title with a sensational performance, firing rounds of 69 and 66 to finish at 9-under par. Hilario clinched the win by two strokes, notching his first victory of the season. The 2027 graduate also secured several key exemptions, including a coveted spot in the 26th Veritex Bank Byron Nelson Junior Championship.

In the Boys 14 & Under Division, Austin Anderson of Gunter made a triumphant return to the winner's circle. After an impressive 2024 season, Anderson posted scores of 71-70 to finish at 3-under par, cruising to a commanding four-shot victory. The win marks the 2029 graduate's first of the 2025 season.

Michelle Lee of San Antonio showcased her short-game prowess to take the Girls 12-18 Division crown. Lee carded rounds of 68 and 73 to finish at 1-under, sealing her second win of the year. The victory follows her triumph at the Texas Girls' Invitational in February and solidifies her spot as one of the top players on tour.
